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Objective

Class Regulation

Manners

Regulation

- Each student is assigned a topic / question on session 1.
- Every student is expected to give a short talk about the assigned topic in class on session 2-7.
- Duration: 2-3 minutes.
- Other than on the assigned topic, students may give more short talks (subject to availability of time).

Grading components

- Delivery : Confident, good gesture, voice quality
- Content : Original, informative
- Fluency : Fluent, hesitation handling
- Accuracy : Language & vocabulary

Assignment Description

2. Group Presentation

Session 9-13

Theme

Introducing Indonesia's precious asset to the world
(culture /tourism / product / natural resource / etc.)

Content (suggested)

- Explanation about the asset
- How it gives impact to the country
- How to preserve and/or promote the asset
- Must include one campaign material (poster/ brochures/ vlog / video documenter/ etc.)

Regulation

- Each group is free to decide the topic of the presentation.
- Duration: 10-15 minutes presentation, 5-10 minutes questions.
- Every student must take part equally.
- Always use English. Any local terms must be well explained in English.
- Use visual aid (ppt slides) effectively.
